(Received the assent of the Government the 16th April, 1991; assent first published in the "Madhya Pradesh Gazette (Extra Ordinary)," dated the 18th April 1991.)

An Act to repeal Chitrakoot Gramodaya Vishwavidyalaya* Adhiniyam 1991 (Act 9, 1991 of MP) and to restructure along the lines of Madhya Pradesh Vishwavidyalaya Adhiniyam 1973 as amended till date.

Be it enacted by the Madhya Pradesh Legislature in the Forty-second Year of the Republic of India as follows:-
